The history of the church at Thessalonica

After being driven out of Philippi (Acts16:11-40), where does Paul go? Acts 17:1

He ends up in Thessalonica, a major city in Greece, still existing today (Thessaloniki).

What do we learn about Paul, comparing Acts 16:22-24 with 17:1-2?; IThess.2:2; ICor.9:16

What was the composition of the church at Thessalonica? Acts 17:1-4

It was comprised of Jews, Greeks, and a number of the leading women. Diverse church.

What does IThess.2:1-12 demonstrate about Paul's ministry to this church? 2:8

Paul had a *deep* pastoral care for them. 'Not only the Gospel but also our own lives...'!

What (as usual) happens to Paul at Thessalonica? Acts 17:4-10; 14:5-6, 19-20;

The Jews, becoming jealous (of conversions) formed a mob. Paul and Silas were sent away.

The intro to the first letter to the Thessalonians...IThess.1:1-5

Having to flee from Thessalonica, how does Paul still relate to them? 2:17-18

He wanted to return but was repeatedly *hindered by Satan*. Eph.6:10-12 warfare! But why?

Why would Satan hinder Paul from returning? He was a fugitive there. See Job 1:6-12, etc.

What are (3) specific things Paul remembers about the Thessalonians? 1:3

1- their work of faith. 2- their labor of love. 3- their endurance by hope in Christ.

Having observed this behavior, what could Paul confidently proclaim? 1:4 Comment?

We know that God has chosen you! By their fruits you shall know them (Jn.15:5).

And what is one reason Paul cites for his 'knowing...'? 1:5

The Gospel was presented in *power*, in the *Holy Spirit*, and w/our full conviction.

Why does Paul emphasize '...not simply with words, but with power...'? 1:5; ICor.1:22-25

The Gospel is only really 'heard' by the called, through the power of the Holy Spirit.
