(6) Eliphaz's Corrupt Theology

Job 4:1-7

- 1 Then Eliphaz the Temanite replied:
- 2 "If someone ventures a word with you, will you be impatient? But who can keep from speaking?
- 3 Think how you have instructed many, how you have strengthened feeble hands.
- 4 Your words have supported those who stumbled; you have strengthened faltering knees.
- 5 But now trouble comes to you, and you are discouraged; it strikes you, and you are dismayed.
- 6 Should not your piety be your confidence and your blameless ways your hope?
- 7 "Consider now: Who, being innocent, has ever perished? NIV

Eliphaz's first speech...4:1-5:27

How would you characterize Eliphaz's first words to Job? 4:1-4 Prov.10:21; Jude 16

They are flattering. Your words have instructed/supported those who stumbled.

But what is his immediate rebuke to Job? 4:5-6 Comment? Rom.12:14

You can give it out but you can't take it! Those in great trial need encouragement, not-

And now, the central issue. What is Eliphaz's theology? 4:7 see Is.53 (cross + resurrection)

The innocent/upright are *never* destroyed or perish! (What about Jesus, Stephen, etc)

And his point in 4:8-11? (note the 'I have observed...')

The judgment of God may come slowly or violently, but it will come. You deserve this!

So what is Eliphaz saying about God, i.e. 'that which is not right' (42:7)? see 40:1-9

Bad things only/always happen to people with whom God is displeased (sin). I define God!

What was the first argument Eliphaz used to support his theology? 4:8a; Prov.3:7, 21:2

As I have observed... That is, this is true because I have seen it! What arrogance!!

What was his second argument to support his theology? 4:12-21; Col.2:16-18

He supposedly had a 'vision' in the night. Message? 4:17+? I speak for God!

Chapter 5:

Of what does Eliphaz accuse Job next? 5:1-7 (Note the crushing words to Job...)

You must be a fool! Your children were crushed (by your sin). Trials don't just 'happen'!

And what is his 'wise' counsel to Job? 5:8-17

Confess your (as yet undisclosed) sins! Bargain with God! trials are the discipline of God

And what does Eliphaz guarantee (by his theology) for this action by Job? 5:18-26

God will restore and heal. You will prosper (like us!). Your children will prosper (not die)

And then, what is his smug conclusion about this? 5:27 (note the 'we...')

We have studied this (therefore it's true!). Hear our wisdom and apply it to yourself!!

Application:

What is at the heart of Eliphaz's corrupt theology? 6:21; Lu.18:9

They believe they are blessed (and protected) because of their (own) righteousness.

From this base, what do they have to do when facing Job's trial? 6:21; 40:2, 8

They're scared by Job's trial. Violates their theology. So, question God and condemn Job.

Where have we heard this corrupt theology (4:7, 5:8, 17, 18) before? 2:4-5

This is Satan's theology, repackaged! Offer God what He wants and He'll bless you!

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
