THE MONARCHY BOOKS IN GENERAL


- Books covering the monarchy
 - + 1 & 2 Samuel
 - + 1 & 2 Kings
 - + 1 & 2 Chronicles
- Originally three books
 - + Division of each into two books necessitated by the Septuagint translation in about 250 BC
 - + Hebrew book of Samuel continued as one book x

1 & 2 SAMUEL IN GENERAL

Background

- + Samuel
 - × Born during Eli's tenure as high priest
 - x Grew up in the Shiloh tabernacle, training to serve the Lord
 - × Considered the last of the judges, and first of the new line of prophets
 - × God used him to found the monarchy
- + Battling the Philistines is prominent
 - × Sea Peoples came to Palestine ~ 1200 BC
 - × Formed the five city-states Gaza, Ashkelon, Ashdod, Ekron, and Gath x


The Five Philistine City States

Background


- + Samuel
 - × Born during Eli's tenure as high priest
 - **x** Grew up in the temple, training to serve the Lord
 - × Considered the last of the judges, and first of the new line of prophets
 - × God used him to found the monarchy
- + Battling the Philistines is prominent
 - × Sea Peoples came to Palestine ~ 1200 BC
 - × Formed the five city-states Gaza, Ashkelon, Ashdod, Ekron, and Gath
 - × ~ 1126 BC, pushed into the interior and highlands, clashing with the Israelites x




1 & 2 SAMUEL IN GENERAL

- Circumstances of the writings
 - + Author is unknown
 - + Objectives
 - x 1 Samuel > birth of monarchy
 - × 2 Samuel > monarchy expands to become a world power
 - + Ultimate purpose
 - × Reveal the founding of the house of David as the family through which the Messiah would come x

I SAMUEL - HIGHLIGHTS

- × Eli
 - + Both a Judge and high priest in Shilo
 - + Reigned for 40 years before Samuel (1145 1105 BC)
- * 1st seven chapters of 1 Sam contain two major events
 - + Capture of the ark of God in battle
 - + A major victory in battle over the Philistines 20 years later *

1 SAMUEL: CHAPTERS 1-7

- Hannah's problem (1 Sam 1.1-8)
 - + One of two wives of Elkanah, a Levite living in Ephraim
 - + Her added problem Peninnah, the other wife, tormented her
- Hannah makes a request of the Lord (1.9-19a)
 - + She prays silently by the Shiloh tabernacle door
 - + The high priest Eli sees her lips moving, assumes she is drunk!
 - Eli responds concerning her petition to the Lord (vs 17) x

- Samuel is born (1.19b-28)
 - + Hannah becomes pregnant and gives birth to the promised son
 - + The annual festival and sacrifice time arrived again
 - + Hannah travels to Shiloh for the annual festival with Samuel
 - + She completes her vow x

- × Hannah's prayer (2.1-10)
 - + God is central
 - + Hannah praised ...
 - x God's character & strength
 - x The ultimate day of God's judgement through His anointed king
 - + She first gave four sources of joy
 - × God has rescued her from her personal affliction (vs 1)
 - × She rejoiced in God's character (vss 2-3)
 - × God's government (vss 4-8)
 - \times She rejoiced in her hope (vss 9-10) \times

- Hannah's prayer (2.1-10) (cont'd)
 - + She then makes predictions about what God will be doing (10b)
 - × He will judge the whole world
 - × He will give strength to His king
 - × He will exalt the power of His anointed
- (vs 11) Elkanah and his family return home x

Sins of the priests

- + Remember the statement repeated throughout Judges "In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes."
- + Eli's sons: 2.12 22
 - (2.12) what a statement, particularly for priests!
 - (2.17) they " ...despised the offering of the Lord"
 - (2.22) they engaged in fornication in the Tabernacle area
 - Eli rebuked them for these evil deeds (2.23-25)
 - Paul warned about these people (Phil 3.17-19)
 - Eli did not follow the Lord's instructions for dealing with such children (Deut 21.18-21) x

- Sins of the priests (cont'd)
 - + Contrasting Eli's sons with Samuel
 - × (2.18-21) Samuel grew as a boy serving the Tabernacle
 - × (2.26) Samuel continued to mature
 - + God's denunciation of Eli (2.27-29)
 - + God's pronouncement of judgement (2.30-34)
 - + But God will not do away with the priesthood altogether (2.35-36) x


- Samuel's calling
 - + The Lord calls Samuel (3.1-9)
 - The "lamp of God had not yet gone out" (vs 3) (Ex 25.31, 27.20-21, 30.6-8)
 - x God calls Samuel in the darkness
 - + God instructs Samuel on His coming actions (3.10-14)
 - × God will end Eli's priesthood and his family's line as priests
 - * 1st: The sons of the family will all die before reaching old age
 - * 2nd: (vs 2.32) Eli will live to see the "distress" of the Tabernacle
 - * 3rd: (vs 2.33) The family would lose its altar rights
 - * 4th: (vs 2.34) The sign these elements of prophecy will occur
 - × (3.14) No sacrifice can atone for their sins!
 - * Num 15.30-31 x

- Samuel's calling (cont'd)
 - + Samuel's response to Eli (3.15-18)
 - + Samuel grows
 - x (vs 19) God made sure that all of Samuel's prophecies came true
 - × (vs 20) All of Israel knew that God spoke through him because everyone soon saw his prophecies come true
 - + (vs 21-4.1a) Note the contrast that Samuel shows compared with Eli's weakness and his sons' evil ways x

- God's punishment enacted
 - + Israel's defeat
 - x The initial battle was unsuccessful (4.1-4)
 - × A disastrous scheme is concocted (4.5-11)
 - × The battle & the ark are lost, Hophni & Phineas killed x

The Philistines Take the Ark of the Covenant

- The Philistines' route from Gath and Ekron to Aphek
- The Philistines' route from Gaza, Ashkelon, and Ashdod to Aphek
- The Israelites bring the Ark of the Covenant from Shiloh to Ebenezer
- The Philistines take the Ark of the Covenant from Aphek to Ashdod
- The Philistines take the Ark of the Covenant from Ashdod to Gath
- The Philistines take the Ark of the Covenant from Gath to Ekron
- The Philistines send the Ark of the Covenant from Ekron to Beth-shemesh

- God's punishment enacted
 - + Israel's defeat
 - × The initial battle was unsuccessful (4.1-4)
 - × A disastrous scheme is concocted (4.5-11)
 - × The battle & the ark are lost, Hophni & Phineas killed
 - + Death of Eli (4.12-22)
 - × A roughed up survivor of the battle ran back to Shiloh
 - x Eli was shocked by the news & he fell & died
 - + The news caused Phineas' pregnant wife to go into labor
 - × Variations on "Ichabod" translations (none good news)
 - * "glory has gone into captivity", "no glory", "where is the glory ?"
 - + What did the Philistines do after defeating the Israelites ? (Ps 78.60-64), (Jer 7.12-14, 26.6-9) xx
